## Rebekah's Easter Remarks

Dear Fine People,

I love Easter. Joyce has been on my case to get this article written, but, as I write, it is the week before our Dedication Sunday for the ***Building For the Future*** Campaign. It has been on my mind and heart. It has all been good, even though there are a few who think that moving forward at this time isn't such a great idea. I believe that the timing has never been more crucial for the ministry we are called to do as a church. But, we cannot question the motives of others... especially if we don't know what their motives are. However, throughout the campaign, hearing the stories that have been shared in small groups, it is clear that this congregation was never meant to hold back, or to wait for a *better day*. This church has historically been very deliberate in deciding to move forward, even when the worldly evidence said otherwise, and there were some who questioned if we would be able to survive. We are in the midst of a "*better day*"... it is the day that our Lord got up, when all the evidence said that his efforts were a failure; that his people had rejected him; that the hope of the world was a false alarm; that he was someone who couldn't grasp reality; that the "real" world, with all its brokenness, is the *only* world. So, Jesus got up anyway, folded up the grave clothes, and walked out of the tomb. There were no more excuses.

But, even the remarkable nature of his resurrection did not mean that everyone was suddenly awake and aware that a *new day*... a new era... a new way of life had come. In fact, even up to the very moment that Jesus was taken up into heaven, Matthew's gospel [28:17] tells us that some people standing right there when it happened *doubted*. I'm so glad that the writers of the gospel left in a little jewel like that. The most faithful disciples of Jesus *doubt*, even today. We exist as a church to be the encouragement to the

world, that Jesus is the new day we long for... He is already here.

Now that you have received this newsletter, it should be **Holy Week**. It is our tradition to gather on Maundy Thursday in Mauldin Hall to share a meal, and to observe the Lord's Supper around the tables, even as Jesus did with his disciples. In John's gospel we have Jesus praying for himself, his disciples... and then we have him praying for all believers... the one's who didn't know they were going to be Jesus Followers... which includes us. The voice of Christ comes through the ages and reaches our hearts when he says:

*"My prayer is not for the disciples alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one: I in them and you in me. May they be brought to complete unity to let the world know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me." (Jn.17:20-23)*

As we celebrate the life of Christ with us still, let us give thanks that we have been given the message of Jesus, so that our fractured world might know unity and peace... and that our facilities and our ministry will communicate that You love us all. This is what we will be celebrating on Sunday, beginning with the Sunrise Worship Service at 6:30 a.m. It's Easter Sunday! Let your unchurched friends and neighbors know, and then invite them to join you. It is going to be wonderful!

## Minute for Prayer

**Living in God's Presence.** Prayer is a way to maintain constant communion with God the Father and God the Son through God the Holy Spirit. It is the means of living out the intense relationship Jesus described in John 15:5-8:

*I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. . . . If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit, and become my disciples.*

Prayer and God's presence are two sides of the same coin. Awareness of God's presence comes as the result of taking time to speak and listen to him through prayer; conversely, the power of prayer is unleashed in the lives of those who spend time in God's presence. Over a period of time, you grow to realize that you are never alone. God's presence is real. You can *feel* it because it is with you wherever you go.

*Dear Friends,*

As you are reading this, there is likely a long sigh of exhale taking place around the church. Not only have we moved through another season of Lent and Holy Week, but we have seen the completion of a very significant campaign to establish our future growth through the facility and the expansion of the body as we do ministry here. The past few weeks have been nothing short of extraordinary, and I count my blessings every day to be able to work among such wonderful people who never seem to lose focus as to what we are called to do.

There's a great deal of excitement here, even as our world spins (seemingly) out of control. Much of this is due to the faith of the body, but it also has to do with the many, many people who have helped keep the focus where it needs to be. The Visioning Team has worked many hours to discern, to plan, to laugh and fellowship, as this congregation has taken huge leaps of faith. Their work deserves much appreciation and gratitude as they have modeled the very sacrificial giving the entire church has been challenged to adopt. The Session, too, has believed in the vision of this place and the future to which we are called. Not only have they embarked upon this journey with confidence, but they have done so while also carrying out their ministry of discipleship, mission, worship, administration and caring for our members. Likewise, our staff has put in many extra hours to make this journey possible, and whose willingness to go above and beyond has been remarkable, especially considering the amount of work they do on a regular basis.

As I'm writing this, we do not yet know the results of the campaign, but the spirit of it has been tremendous,

and it has done great things for this congregation regardless of the numbers. We have been able to share our relationships through this place in a new way. We have been able to get excited about what is going on. We have been purposeful in our ministry throughout and these are positives that can only improve where we go from here. It is all a very nice reminder of how powerful the Spirit is at work in this place. We are a blessed church!

While this has been part of the recent journey, we have also journeyed with Jesus again this Spring, following the events that led to his death and resurrection. What a powerful time of year it is, too. We are privileged to walk with Jesus, but also to share in his life and ministry. The study that Rebekah and I led was not heavily attended, but it was a chance for several of us to reflect deeply on the idea of sacrifice throughout the history of the Jewish people and how this culminated in the sacrifice of Jesus. That this gift was offered on our behalf is nothing short of remarkable, miraculous and amazing. We owe God nothing more because of this, and yet our lives are therefore to be lived out as acts of gratitude for this great gift. Jesus was not a fundraiser, and yet he gave everything he had. Our generosity pales in comparison, but this idea also challenges us to follow even more faithful and ever more closely to the teachings of our Lord. You are all in my prayers as we contemplate the future and as we continue our ministry with the confidence that God always goes before us.

# Notes from the Preschool . . .

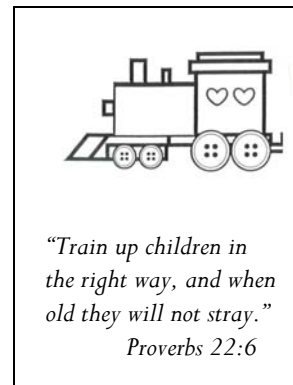
We are excited to offer these great opportunities for families in the church and preschool.

- **Parenting with Positive Discipline** Workshop Series – Four Friday nights (April 23 + 30, May 7 + 14) from 7 – 9pm. Childcare will be available for infants through 5<sup>th</sup> grade. The workshop is free and will be conducted by Kathy Kranendonk, director of the preschool. Childcare will be \$5 per child per night, max \$15 per family per night. *Registration is required (by April 16).*

This workshop addresses our goal as parents: for our children to develop self discipline, responsibility, and positive capabilities and attitudes. It is based on the philosophy of Alfred Adler and Rudolf Dreikurs, and examines discipline techniques that are both effective and inspire an atmosphere of mutual respect in the home.

Have you ever heard yourself saying “I’ve told you a hundred times to...!”? Is the hundredth time the one they will hear? Can bedtime be more agreeable? Can chores be done more cheerfully? Can siblings learn to share?

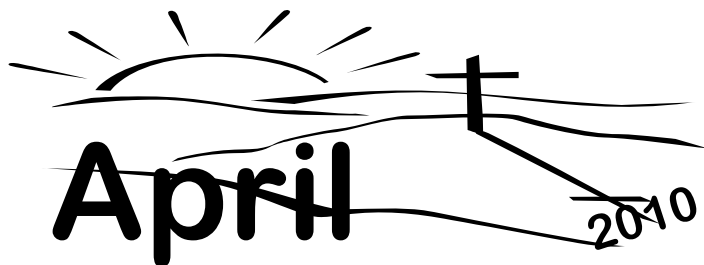

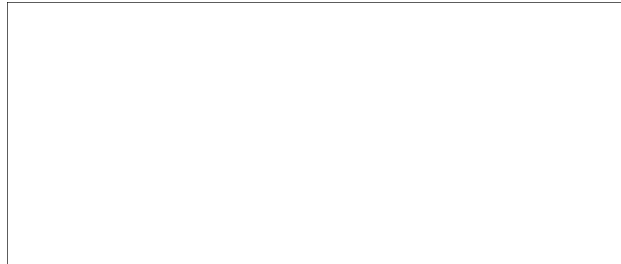
